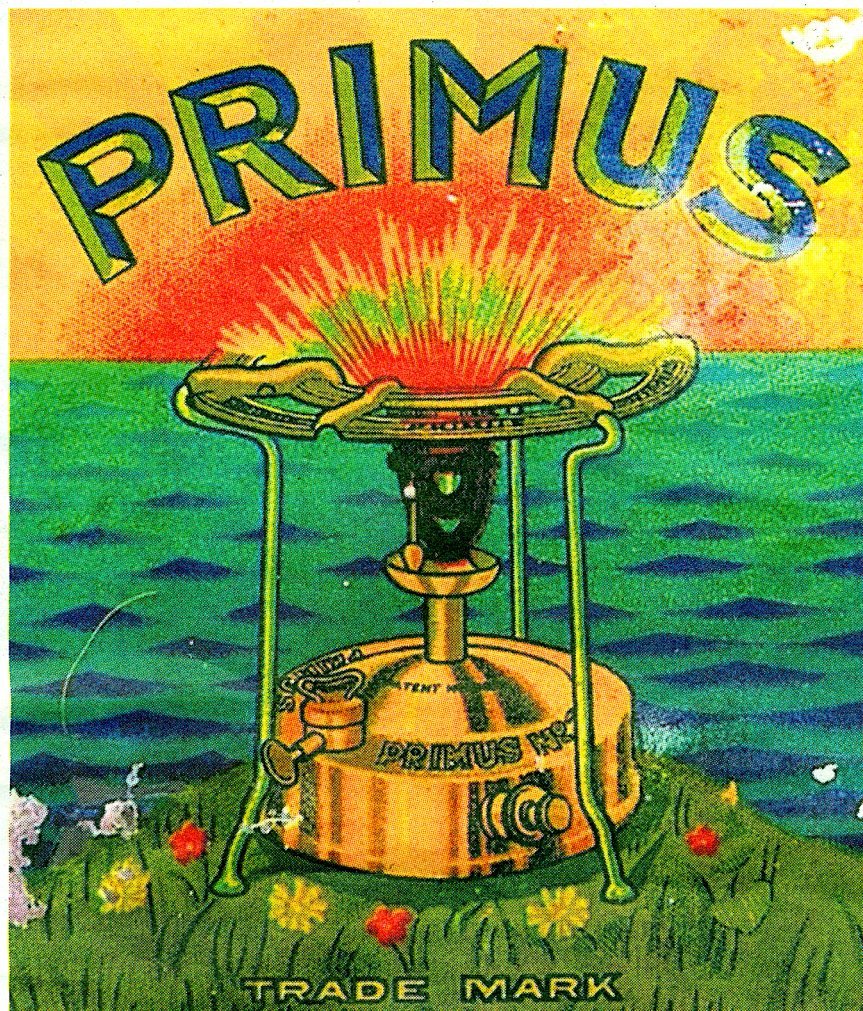


Pannier Antiques, South Molton

He has a rare example of a William Baron piece, who set up his own Barnstaple pottery in 1895/96.

Immediately prior to this W L Baron used the famous Fishley pottery in Fremington.

During the few months he was there he signed his pottery W L Baron Fremington Barnstaple. A rare example of this mark may be seen on a pair of vases on the stall. Another rare example of Baron pottery includes the initials WHG, William Henry Garnish who was apprenticed to Baron about 1915.
